### **Workshop Descriptions:**

#### **Beading**

We offer both peyote style and flat work beading workshops. In the flatwork beading class you will learn the trailing flower design of the Métis People. The Peyote stitch is an off loom bead weaving technique that can either be done flat or as a tube. In both classes you will have a project in the works and the knowledge of the unique Métis beading style. Limit 10 participants per class.

#### **Métis Embroidery Basics**

Come and learn the basics of Métis embroidery. All supplies will be provided. You will have the opportunity to design and make an embroidered pouch adorned with floral embroidery from a traditional artisan. Limit 10 participants per class

#### **SCYAP Workshops**

In this interactive session is for all ages, you will learn a Métis themed art project with SCYAP's

Aboriginal Art Leaders, ending a completed project to take home.

### **Reconciliation? What is it? What can I do?**

The Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada (TRC), established in 2008, documented the history and impacts of the Indian residential school (IRS) system on survivors, families, communities and anyone personally affected by the IRS experience. The TRC released an Executive Summary of its findings along with 94 "calls to action" regarding reconciliation between Canadians and Indigenous peoples. This seems like an overwhelming challenge to most individuals. In this session participants will discuss the TRC, the calls to action and what we, as individuals, can do to support reconciliation. Limit 25 participants per class.

### **Kids Can Bead**

Designed for children 8 and up, participants will learn the basics of beading including how to thread a needle, tie a simple knot and make a daisy chain. Then combine those new skills to create a beautiful daisy chain bracelet to take home. Limit 10 Participants per class.

### **Métis Story Telling**

In an interactive format various Michif storytellers from Gabriel Dumont Local 11 will engage the audience with contemporary and historical stories. Join them to discover if their stories spark a memory or personal connection. Gabriel Dumont Local 11 is a Métis cultural and educational non-profit organization in Saskatoon dedicated to sharing Métis history and culture.

### **Métis Finger Weaving**

An art form used mostly to create belts, sashes, straps, and other similar items through a non-loom weaving process. Unlike loom-based weaving, there is no separation between weft and warp strands, with all strands playing both roles. In this class you will learn how to weave your own Métis style sash. Limit 10 Participants per class.

### **Storytelling with Ed**

Using a variety of instruments the multi-talented Ed Peekeekoot leads this participatory workshop in an interactive mix of stories and songs.
